### **Ophthalmological Experiences**

Mainly treating patients with uveitis and insufficient capsular or zonular support with iris, and intrascleral haptic fixation. Main interest areas are management of Infectious Uveitis, intraocular lens placement in Complex capsular situations and management of subluxated lens.
